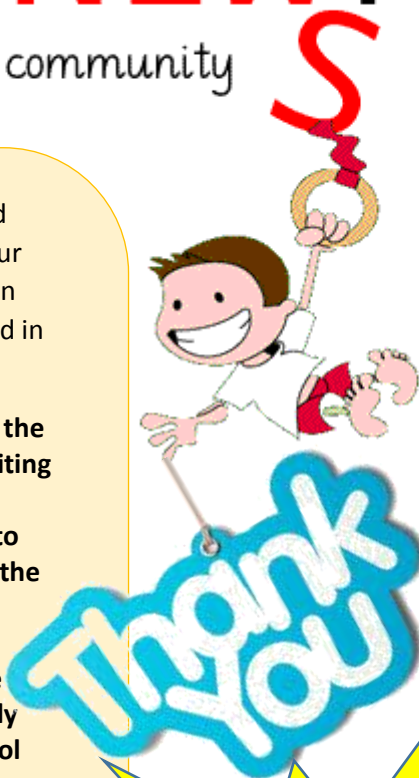

If you know you are going to be late to pick up at the end of the day please notify Reception so that arrangements can be made for your child.
