


Year 3 Term 1

Wider Curriculum

Timelines and chronology will be learnt in relation to the Stone Age. Bronze Age and Iron Age. Along with this, how people lived during these prehistoric time periods will be researched and investigated. This will include how they dressed, what they ate, the types of places they lived and how they sourced their lifestyles. As well as this, specific Stone Age locations in the United Kingdom will be studied including Stonehenge and Skara Brae. How we have learnt about the past will also be explored.
