Monday	<p>Watch: Numberblocks - Ten - on YouTube. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0oEZc2Deeqc&list=PLxWjrBIVAOi33adPdJ6aSXyGPsY10oV6d&index=5</p> <p>Challenge: How many fruits were there on the tree in the video?</p> <p>Can you name them all?</p> <p>If you cannot access YouTube to watch the Numberblocks, ask your child to find 10 small objects. Draw a 10 frame on a piece of paper (a ten frame is attached to this document so you know what it looks like) then get the child to place all the objects on the 10 frame.</p> <p>Challenge: How do they know there are 10 objects? If you take one away how many are there now? How did you work it out?</p>	<p>Watch the Youtube Video of Geraldine the Giraffe sound 'g'. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=P2DdC5Q6D64</p> <p>Use a book/magazine/comic and find words that have 'g' in them.</p> <p>Challenge: Is the sound at the beginning or the end?</p> <p>For a more challenging sound, watch Geraldine the Giraffe sound 'ai'. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=LnXaN-CvR9s</p> <p>Repeat steps above.</p>	<p>Watch the episode - Go Jettors - Amazon Rainforest - https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b07ff060/go-jettors-series-1-19-amazon-rainforest-south-america</p> <p>Ask your child to tell you where the tree frog was found? What sound did it make? Which rainforest insect steals the picnic?</p> <p>Challenge: Can your child explain what happens when the tree frogs aren't there to eat the ants?</p>	<p>Watch the clip from Cbeebies - What animals make the most noise in the rainforest - https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p011mwwt</p> <p>Challenge: What animals live in the rainforest? Can your child write a list?</p> <p>If you cannot access this, ask your child to think about what animals might live in a rainforest and write a list. You may need to explain the habitat of a rainforest. (See picture attached to this document below)</p>

<p style="text-align: center;">Tuesday</p>	<p>Go to the Top Marks Website and find Ladybird Spots - https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/ladybird-spots</p> <p>Using the Matching tab click 1 to 5. The child has to match the ladybirds to the correct number by counting the spots.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you use numbers 1 to 10 to match the correct Ladybirds?</p> <p>If you cannot access the website, ask your child to find 10 small objects around the home. Write the numbers 1 to 10 on some paper (You could get the child to help you to support their number formation). Ask the child to put the correct number of objects on to a number of your choosing.</p>	<p>Education City (educationcity.com) Letters and Sounds - Phase 2 - 'g' Phase 3 - 'ai'</p> <p>Look at the letter 'g' then move on to 'ai' for a challenge.</p> <p>If this cannot be accessed, go on an object hunt around the house.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you find objects that start with 'g'.</p> <p>Now try finding objects with 'ai' in the name.</p>	<p>Using Phonicsplay.co.uk find 'Train Your Brain' in Phase 2 for 'to' and Phase 3 for 'me'.</p> <p>If you cannot access this, write the words on to a piece of paper and ask your child to read it to you. Talk about what is tricky about the word. Sound button the word.</p>	<p>Using Drawing Pad (App) or Drawing App Doodle (App) on a tablet or Paint (Program) on a computer ask your child to draw an animal they might find in the Rainforest.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you use the colouring in functions?</p>

This can be found on BBC Schools Nursery Rhymes - https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-songs-index/zhwgdwx</p> <p>Challenge: Can you think of and sing any other songs/poems with 10 in?</p>	<p>Ask your child to write the sound 'g' and then repeat it back to you. Now write it 5 more times.</p> <p>Challenge: Write 3 words that start with 'g'. Write 3 words that end with 'g'</p>	<p>Ask your child to read the words of the week. Remember they are tricky so they cannot be sounded out.</p> <p>Now write the words 5 times each and circle the tricky bit of the word.</p>	<p>Using different materials from around the house complete the challenge.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you make a Rainforest animal collage?</p>

	<p>10 fat sausages sizzling in the pan, 10 little fingers and 10 little toes, 10 in the bed.</p>	<p>If the child finds this easy, move on to sound 'ai'. Thursday	<p>Education City (educationcity.com) - Eggs for Breakfast - Counting to 10 game.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you remember what you had for breakfast?</p> <p>If you cannot access Education City, ask your child to find 10 objects in your home and put them in a line. Tell the child to close their eyes take 1 object away. Ask the child to count the objects. (Do this taking away different amounts.)</p> <p>Challenge: How many more objects will make 10?</p>	<p>Play I spy using the Rainforest picture attached below - I spy with my little eye something beginning with 'p'.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you see anything that begins or ends with the letter 'g' or contains the sound 'ai'.</p>	<p>Draw a picture of your favourite rainforest animal and label it.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you write 3 labels on your picture?</p>	<p>Today the child will become the explorer. Support your child to make an explorers outfit.</p> <p>Challenge: What does an explorer need? Can you make these things?</p> <p>(You may need to explain to the child and/or show them a picture of an explorer, explain they need a hat, binoculars - two toilet rolls, a backpack cereal box and string.)</p> <p>Now go on an adventure as an explorer either in your garden or on a walk.</p>
Friday	<p>Number Formation - Write the numbers</p> <p>5 and 10 on a piece of paper. Do this five times for each number.</p> <p>Challenge: Make the numbers more colourful.</p>	<p>Using Phonicsplay.co.uk find 'pick a picture.' Start on phase 2 and if your child needs more challenge move to phase 3.</p> <p>If you cannot access this, write these words on a piece of paper - cat, dog,</p>	<p>Enjoy listening to the stories</p> <p>The Tiger Who Came To Tea by Judith Kerr (Can be found on YouTube)</p> <p>Rainforest Adventure by Tony Mitton and Ant</p>	<p>Make an animal house for the bugs and/or animals in your garden. 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
PSHE and Wellbeing Tasks:

Challenge: Write a letter to a friend or family member they are missing.


