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
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Rainbow Cupcakes

These fun and tasty rainbow cupcakes can be made as part of your School Diversity Week celebrations (or at any time throughout the year) to help start a conversation about diversity, acceptance and equal rights for everyone.

You will need:

For the cupcakes:

- 250g butter, softened
- · 250g caster sugar
- 4 medium eggs
- 250g self-raising flour
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 tbsp milk
- food colouring (in red, orange, yellow, green, blue and purple)

For the icing:

- 140g butter, softened
- 280g icing sugar
- 1-2 tbsp milk
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp vanilla extract
- multi-coloured chocolate, sweets, fruit pieces or sprinkles

Equipment

- · large mixing bowl · sieve
- electric whisk
- 6 small bowls
- paper cupcake cases
- 12-hole cupcake tray

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C (gas mark 4).
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy.
- 3. Add the eggs, one by one, combining them into the mixture as you go.
- 4. Fold in the flour.
- 5. Add the milk and the vanilla extract, slowly stirring until it is all mixed together.







- 6. Divide the cake mixture into 6 bowls. Add a few drops of food colouring to the different bowls and mix until you have the 6 different colours of the rainbow flag.
- 7. Line a baking tray with the cupcake cases. Add a tablespoon of purple cake mix to each cupcake case. Repeat this process with the blue, green, yellow, orange and then red cake mixtures.
- 8. Once you have completed the layers of the rainbow cupcake, tap the baking tray on the work surface a couple of times to remove any air bubbles.
- 9. Bake on a middle shelf in the oven for 15-20 minutes.
- 10. Once cooked, leave them to cool in the baking tray for 5 minutes before removing them and placing them on a cooling rack.
- 11. While the cupcakes cool, make the icing. Beat together the butter and icing sugar until light and creamy. Add the vanilla extract.
- 12. Once the cupcakes have cooled, spoon the buttercream onto the top of each cupcake and decorate with sprinkles or multi-coloured chocolate, sweets or fruit pieces.

- blackberries


Equipment:

- 2. Carefully, slide the fruit onto the skewers remember not to put hands or fingers behind the pieces of fruit where the skewer will come through!
- 3. Create a rainbow pattern with the fruit pieces by sliding them onto the skewers in order.

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

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


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
