

### Subject Specific Vocabulary

<b>Artefact</b>	An object from the past that tells us something about how people used to live.
<b>Childhood</b>	Time in a person's life when they are a child.
<b>Housewife</b>	An old-fashioned name for a married woman who stays at home and looks after the house and children.
<b>Museum</b>	A place that people can visit that contains important objects linked to history, science or art.
<b>Past</b>	Something that has already happened.
<b>Present</b>	Something that is happening now.
<b>Today</b>	On this day.
<b>Victorian</b>	Victorian times were the years between 1837 and 1901 when Queen Victoria was Queen of the United Kingdom.

### Sticky Knowledge

- Important life events include birthdays, religious festivals or family celebrations. Some life events happen every year and some happen at certain stages of human life.
- Common words and phrases, such as here, now, then, yesterday, last week, last year, years ago and a long time ago, can be used to describe the passing of time.
- Photographs can be ordered chronologically on a timeline.
- Everyday objects, such as baby bottles, clothing, toys and books, can tell us about childhood in the past.
- A family tree is a diagram that shows the relationship between people in several generations of a family.
- A coronation is a ceremony where the crown is placed on the head of the new king or queen.
- The coronation of Queen Elizabeth II took place on 2nd June 1953 at Westminster Abbey, London.
- The 1950s were different from today.
- The way people use land changes over time. For example, in the 1950s there were fewer cars, so fewer roads were needed. Today lots of people have cars, so there are many more roads for people to drive on and driveways for parking.
